#### **PROPOSITION 65**

#### **Enacted by referendum in 1986**

Requires warnings for any exposure to a chemical known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.



#### **PROPOSITION 65**

**WARNING:** This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.

**WARNING:** Consuming this product can expose you to chemicals including [name of one or more chemicals], which is [are] known to the State of California to cause cancer and/or (as appropriate) [name of one or more chemicals], which is [are] known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. #### WARNING:


#### WARNING

The air in and around this jet bridge sometimes contains jet engine exhaust, fumes from jet fuel, and exhaust from equipment used to service airplanes. Those substances contain chemicals known to the state to cause cancer, birth defects, and other reproductive harm.






### PROPOSITION 65 SHAKEDOWN Onus is typically on manufacturers Unless retailer has own private label

#### But ... plaintiff lawyers don't care

#### WHAT IS THE SHAKEDOWN PROCESS?

#### Revised Proposition 65 Requirements are going into effect, beginning August 30, 2018

## Required language of the warnings has been changed from "contains" to "may expose"

#### **Category Shelf-Tags** to **Point-of-Display Shelf-Tags**









#### Amend contracts to require indemnification for Proposition 65 claims.





#### Determine which products require warnings

#### Send information pamphlets to suppliers

Send letters to all suppliers asking them to identify whether their product will expose consumers to chemicals known to the State of California ... (+ indemnity)





#### **Product Warnings**



# Typically the easiest, because the supplier is managing the labelling and ensuring compliance.

#### However, may create some logistics problems

#### **Point-of-Display Shelf-Tags**



must be prominently displayed with such conspicuousness as compared with other words, statements, or designs () render the warning likely to be seen, real, and crotecid by an ordinary individual under custo () conditions of purchase.

WARNING: Certain foods and beverages sold or served here can expose you to chemicals including acrylamide in many fried or baked foods, and mercury in fish, which are known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. # The word WARNING must be hyperlinked on the product display page, or by prominently displaying the warning to the purchaser prior to purchasing.
